Mission Leadership Team

God moves in mysterious ways. Last Monday I flew from Christchurch to Auckland to meet with some other Presbyterian Pastors. On the plane, I got talking to the person beside me who turned out to be a close friend of Darryl and Michelle. He is the pastor of Life South – a branch of the large Life Church in Auckland. Now was this a co-incidence? We had an interesting chat about the way they structure their multi-site congregations, and the pros and cons of different models. It was helpful to be able to reflect in this way with someone who was involved first-hand with one particular model.

One of the Pastors present at the meeting was Jim Wallace of Bethlehem, Tauranga – a Presbyterian Church plant. You may have seen Jim in the media news – it was his Church which had copied the Tui advertisements. Jim described the media frenzy (15 paper reporters, 4 TV interviews, and emails from media all over the world) over the issue – and the **relationship he had forged with the marketing manager of DB**. While we were there, the marketing manager arrived with a set of posters which they had got their advertising agency (Saatchi and Saatchi) to draft – they were very clever and expertly done. Jim had purchased a Bible to present to him and introduced him to an Auckland Minister for follow-up. The Bethlehem Church now has some professionally designed billboards plus received enormous sympathetic coverage. At the same time he was able to dialogue on the **abuse of alcohol** and the damage being done.

While in Auckland I received a call from Janice to say that the Doctors at Dunedin Hospital had suggested she go down as her mother was failing quickly. They expected her to die that night, but in the morning she picked up again. We wondered why the Lord was letting her linger when she so much wanted to go to be with Him. Then a couple of nights later Janice was able to lead her mother in a meaningful prayer where her mum forgave certain people and released all bitterness from the past. They were then able to talk about the next life and shared something of their hopes and dreams, with the re-assurance that they would be together again in the future. Janice said it was such a special time and made the lingering and waiting so worthwhile. (At time of writing this Janice's mother is slowly declining with all medication withdrawn).

I was very encouraged last week when I visited **Tony Christie and Margaret**. Jeanette has been wonderful in helping Margaret in days gone by. Margaret was in respite care. When I popped in to see her, Jeanette was about to take her to the bank; Lisa was visiting Margaret, Stewart had been an hour before, and when I went into her room there was a card from the CM team proudly displayed, plus one from Kate.

Tony had received visits from Phil, Don (several), and many other men from the men's group and growth group. He was so effusive in his appreciation of the care and concern, plus the prayers. He is well on the road to recovery now.

These are just two examples of the sort of thing that happens each day as people reach out and care for each other. It's a typically "Jesus" sort of thing to do, don't you think!!

A recurring theme in our Wednesday morning prayer meeting is concern for those in our community who attended Sunday school and church when they were children, but have since walked away from active participation in church life. To them God is just a vague memory from their childhood, someone out there who may be of some help sometime in the future but not now.

We often think of these as prodigals; they grew up knowing the blessings of living in the Father's house but left to do their own thing. Our prayer is that they will 'come to their senses' and return to the Lord, just as the prodigal did. We pray that the seeds sown long ago will spring forth and bear fruit.

I mentioned in my sermon last week that the Holy Spirit convicts of sin and convinces people of the efficacy of Jesus' sacrifice to provide our salvation. The people who called out 'crucify him' and mocked him on the cross were cut to the heart when Peter preached on the day of Pentecost. What changed? The Holy Spirit was let loose, convicting and convincing. If you have children who have walked away from the Lord never give up praying for them. As Jesus said; "I give them eternal life, and they shall never perish; no one can snatch them out of my hand" (John 10:28).

At the other end seeds need to be sown in children while they are young and receptive. This is why we place so much effort on ministering to children and supporting their faith. To this end we will be hosting a **holiday programme** in the 2nd week of the July holidays. This fun activity based programme will run over 3 mornings and will provide an opportunity for children to hear a positive Christian message - for some this may be the only opportunity they get in the absence of Bible in School at WMS. Please pray for Catherine and Julie as they put this together. Maybe you'd like to be involved - see Catherine.

Coming up on the 27th June we are planning a **shared lunch** after the service. Service will finish with the usual morning tea followed by some fun activities and lunch. Soup and rolls will be provided and we ask that you bring a plate of finger food. This will be a good opportunity to mix and mingle and get to know some of the new people in our midst. There's no better way to fellowship than around food- Jesus did this all the time!

KAIROS 2010

The Kairos course has once again been run at HPCC. Starting on the 26th April and wrapping up on 22nd of May, the nine lessons together with homework required about 40 hours of contribution from each of the participants.

So what is Kairos anyway? If you've heard of the 'Perspectives Course' its similar but shorter. The Kairos course is an interactive course that provides an exciting overview of the World Christian movement from Genesis to the 21st century. The course takes a look at the Biblical, historical, strategic and cultural aspects of the spread of the gospel. This course has been taken by over 20,000 people in 39 countries all over the world, in 20 different languages.

Twelve folk signed up this time, some like, Leilani, Annette, Alan and Sharron have taken the course because they are off to India on a short term mission trip. Others like Christina, Joseph and Sara and Hee are from other churches. Dulcie, Anne and Wendy decided to see just what the course was all about.

Now this course has come to a close what do our graduates have to say?

- "This has highlighted that there is a part for everyone of us in the Great Commission"
- "Prayer is the most powerful tool in missionary life!"
- "Kairos is a great foundational course for missions. It doesn't just inspire you to want to go but it puts you among the cloud of witnesses, giving context and history in the great scheme of Christian missionary activity."
- "A Biblical perspective with cultural understanding."
- "Revealing, eye-opening, exciting, realised its truth. Do we have the courage to act on it? Prayer is really essential so we don't miss God's opportunity, His blessing, provision and fulfillment."
- "I have had my mind opened to a whole new world of Church work. That God is a God of missions that He started long ago."

Watch out for the next course - why don't you also give it a go.
