Hi everyone,

Two weeks ago we enjoyed an evening together with all of the community projects that are based from HPCC and the respective trusts. Did you know we connect with 950 people each week through our various projects? (And those numbers don't include the youth initiatives like 24/7!) It's a wonderful opportunity to be the hands and feet of our Lord in an expression of His love locally. We will be highlighting these in the morning services soon.

One of the things we are doing in Term 3 is providing opportunities to be equipped in reaching out to people in ministering the love and healing of Jesus. David Peters (whom many will remember from last year's Men's Camp) and his wife Greta will be leading a **Supernatural school (13 - 14 August)** which will be a great opportunity to learn or up skill on how to pray for people for healing, and speak words of knowledge and prophecy. Registration forms are available at reception. To maximize this weekend we are running **four "Kingdom Classes" on Wednesday nights** (see notice in this newsletter for details) to help prepare the ground with teaching, and to practice what we've learnt after the event. This will also connect with the Kingdom Come series we have been doing on Sunday evenings at Hornby. We know that unless we actually do something with what we've learnt it usually becomes another binder in our bookshelf. By meeting together it will provide a safe place to encourage each other and continue momentum in reaching out to others. Jesus performed almost all of his miracles "in the marketplace" (i.e. outside of the church), so wouldn't it be great to continue build a culture where it's normal to offer to pray for people and see God touching people's lives.

### Change in Support Ministries

Over the last few months we have been looking at the state of play in the support areas; particularly Finance, Go Global and Administration. In the past year or two we have added in a new trust (YSWC), another congregation (West Melton / Halkett – with Rolleston likely), new ministries being added and also a number of the accounting processes have been brought in house too.

With this in mind we have looked to create a new accounts clerk role that will be focused solely on financial support and this role will also be the Go Global enabler – who will be responsible for ensuring Go Global are supported in the work that they look to complete. We are pleased to announce that, as of Monday 5<sup>th</sup> July, Sharon will be moving from the Administration team into this role. This change is partially funded by Go Global and as such will be fiscally neutral in terms of finances.

Due to the space that this has left in our Admin team, this week we have also welcomed Abi into the role that Sharon has left behind. Abi will be joining Marya in the Admin Office, with Marya now working from **9am -1pm** and Abi working from **12pm – 4pm, Monday – Friday.**

## West Melton

As I write this I am coming to the end of my penultimate block course in Dunedin which means the training phase of my ministry internship has only 5 months to run. This is both exciting and daunting at the same time. It's exciting because it will mean the end to assignments and student obligations but it's daunting to think of stepping up to ministry as one ordained for word and sacrament. Catherine and I are in a time of praying and seeking the Lord's guidance as we explore our options for next year; the important thing is for us to know his call and we would appreciate your prayer and support in that regard.

This block course has been memorable on a number of fronts. We are the first group of students to use the refurbished facilities of the Knox Centre for Ministry and Leadership; this includes new teaching spaces, common room and offices which are a pleasure to work in. Also a group of us were accommodated in a nearby guest house which reminded me of my flatting days. This enabled us to enjoy closer fellowship with one another and a real highlight was sharing our struggles and praying for one another. One of the criticisms of the move away from the old residential model of training (where students were housed in off campus housing around Dunedin) was that there would be a lose of collegiality- that special bond achieved between people as they undertake the same journey. This has not happened as we have grown very close to one another in genuine care and support. What a blessing that is!

Another thing that has impressed me this block course has been the caliber of preaching from the first year students. They are given an exercise where they take a sermon they have preached, shortened to 12 minutes, and preach it too the class. This is actually quite challenging because unlike in church everyone is paying very close attention and are grading their effort! But I can tell you the Presbyterian Church has some excellent preachers in the making. If they did that well in this difficult setting I can only imagine how good they must be in the parish.

### 24-7 National Hui

During the last week of school term, I had an experience I hope to never forget. 24-7 Youthworkers across the country made a journey to Waitangi, Northland for our National Hui. We spent a short time in a place brimming with history. After a few days of intense input, we were farewelled by the local tangata. This was an incredible blessing, as they invited us to sit where their ancestors had debated whether or not to sign the Treaty of Waitangi. In the photo you might be able to see an old post. This was where they stood; asking what impact the Treaty would have on future generations. In a place that is marked by pain for many of those in our nation, we experienced both grace and acceptance, although to many we would have symbolised those who came and took.

The Minister at Waitangi challenged us afresh to consider the impact we have as youth workers on the young people around us. We were invited to come and stand beside this post, where many had gone before us and consider how our future might in turn weave with young people around us. I believe this is a challenge to all of us: How does our future weave with those people around us, and what does it mean to be a "people builder"?

The other thing that excited me was hearing of my spiritual whakapapa. The Clapham Society included the first wave of missionaries to come to New Zealand. They were a radical bunch; most in their early 20's and were involved in the movement to stop slavery. The Clapham Society were also involved in the establishment of the Bible Society, the Tract Society and the Sunday School movement - although these might not seem particularly radical to us - for a culture and a people who were largely illiterate these were incredibly worthwhile endeavours. Their guiding principle was to see a neighbor, not a home, and to reorient their lives around God's calling. It was exciting to have something in my history that I could be proud of, my spiritual ancestors in this land were a pretty on to it bunch!!

This is a tiny snippet of that which I was challenged in and learnt, and I don't have space to talk about more. In short, it was a huge blessing to be at Waitangi, the birthplace of our nation and to be challenged in my beliefs about that birthplace and the subsequent journey.
